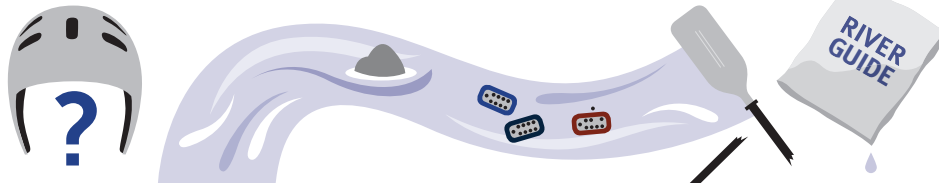

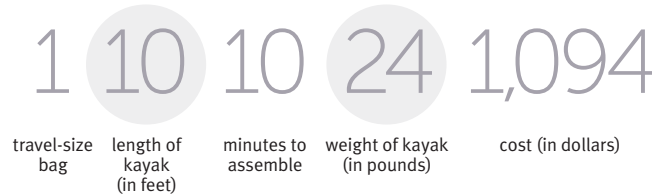
Whitewater rafting season is just around the corner. Find an adventure that matches your interest.



IF YOU'RE A...	RIVER	TOUR	DIFFICULTY	INSIDER INFO
Movie fanatic	Chattooga River; leave from Long Creek, SC (121 miles from Atlanta)	The Chattooga River Section III trip with Wildwater Ltd. Rafting (www.wildwaterrafting.com) rolls through the area where <i>Deliverance</i> was filmed.	Class II-III	Don't let the movie association scare you. This moderate trip has one or two tough rapids (Bull Sluice is the best).
Wildlife lover	Penobscot River; leave from Bingham, ME (116 miles from Portland)	North Country Rivers' (www.ncrivers.com) Penobscot River trip starts out gently and works up to Class V rapids.	Class II-V	Owner Jim Murton says to keep an eye out for moose, deer, eagles, otters, beavers and maybe even a falcon.
Dinosaur enthusiast	Green and Yampa rivers; leave from Steamboat Springs, CO (169 miles from Denver)	Lodore Canyon River Rafting on the Green River, through the Dinosaur National Monument with AdventureBound River Expeditions (www.adventureboundusa.com)	Class II-III	General manager Tom Kleinschnitz says this is the most beautiful trip he offers, with "geology from a billion years" along the way.
Wine aficionado	American River South Fork; leave from Placerville, CA (128 miles from San Francisco)	Two-day wine-tasting and rafting trip with Mariah Wilderness Expeditions (www.mariahwe.com)	Class II-III	Guides will teach you about the grapes that grow around the river as you go by. With luxury campsites, this is certainly not roughing it.
Solitude seeker	Salt River; leave from halfway between Globe, AZ and Show Low (about 150 miles from Phoenix)	Try a full-day, multiday or camping trip with Salt River Rafting, LLC (www.gobluesky.com)	Class III-IV	Co-owner Mike Whittington says the secluded location in the Sonoran Desert—yes, rafting in the desert—is the real draw to this adventure.

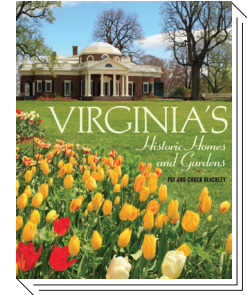
Citibot is made by the Charleston, SC-based **Folbot** (www.folbot.com), the first North American manufacturer of folding kayaks.

Legendary Landscapes



TAKE A VISUAL TOUR OF VIRGINIA'S HISTORIC HOMES AND GARDENS.

Founded in 1607, Virginia has a lot of history, and the survival of homes and plantations from the 17th to the 19th century proves it. Virginia's Historic Homes and Gardens lends a photographic eye to these beautifully restored and well-maintained sites throughout the state, including Lee Hall Mansion—the last remaining large antebellum plantation house in the Lower Peninsula—in Newport News; George Washington's Mount Vernon plantation (outside Washington, DC); and Richmond's John Marshall House, home of the fourth Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court.
